In this year of 2010 Global Horizons has added several new projects to its continually expanding portfolio of work that seeks to bring reconciliation and the redeeming work of the Christ to people from many walks of life. We wrote last spring and on our web site, www.globalhz.org, of a project that began working with disabled children and their families in Asia. Another new venture is taking place in Bulgaria to reach out to the Roma people there. New work with leaders in Cameroon has begun, as well as with students in Ethiopia, and India. Liberia has new work as does Uganda and Ghana.

As we see this kind of growth we are grateful for the opportunity to provide services needed so people can help people. We don't want to forget that this work is about people. It is about people who are disenfranchised or have not experienced the grace and love that is available. 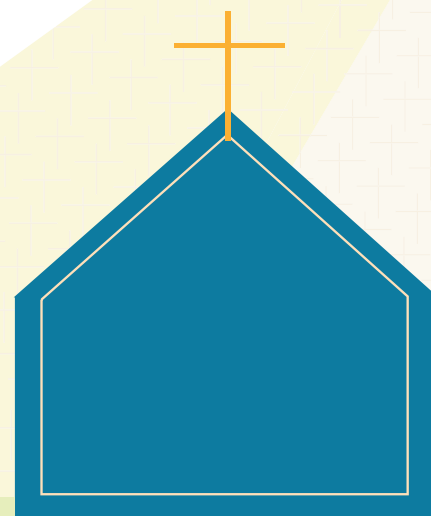
Mosaic 21
with *Mihal Kreko in Croatia*

Mihal Kreko, the leader of a GHI project in Croatia has come to visit us! (You will see him pictured elsewhere in this publication.) Mihal is an amazing leader who was not deterred in growing the church since the previous political regime, nor by the challenges of a new government over the last 20 years. He is truly creative as he works with community leadership to help them develop stronger community and find new ways for the church to thrive among community members.

Currently, he is working with community leaders to build a community center where activities can be held to benefit the 55,000 living in the area. This center will also be used to house the church that Mihal is pastoring. Getting a pre-fabricated building shipped from the US to erect on the site was somewhat of a miracle. Beyond that, Mihal is getting the necessary government permissions for the building site, free duty for the building, and cooperation in construction. All of these seem only to be a further demonstration that God is at work in this project. And by the way, while funding has been provided for all this, Mihal still needs personal support for his family and the ministry which he leads.

In addition to Mihal's funding is a need to recruit some international teams of people who will come alongside this project and go to Croatia to build out needed rooms to complete the needed

EMMAUS ASSOCIATES
with *PAUL ARNESON*

Emmaus Associates became a project of GHI at the end of 2008. The experience Paul Arneson had leading in Christian organizations, as well as local churches, has given him significant insight into how leaders can lead effectively. In the last two years he has come alongside numerous Christian leaders in this country, and elsewhere, to encourage, equip and empower them to greater service for the Kingdom of God. Sometimes that has looked like a face to face meeting with a leader to discuss what is going on in the ministry and take action and accountability on steps to improve an organization. Sometimes it is an email or Skype conversation where there

is confidential discussion of personal issues related to character development and the heart of the leader. Other times, Paul has been training nationals who are ascending the leadership ladder in their organizations making community ministry more wholistic and integrated with Biblical principles.

Paul recently spoke to church mission leaders and facilitated discussion on the topic of wholistic ministry. All this took place as part of the regional meetings of Advancing Churches in Missions Commitment (ACMC) at Berean Baptist Church in Burnsville, Minnesota. As many churches are discovering more and more that the Gospel message calls them to be compassionate, and deal with issues not traditionally central to missions, there is need for new models for ministry. What do churches need to keep in mind as they consider the issues of AIDS and poverty, orphans and human trafficking (to name a few) to be true to their calling and Jesus' style of ministry? It was a wonderful discussion and helpful for all involved.

EMPOWERING WOMEN IN INDIA
with *KAREN FRANCOIS*

Karen Francois has just returned from India where she is managing an ethical World Fair Trade Organization certified business initiative of an organization whose mission is anti-human trafficking and community empowerment. The business initiative, Jacobs Well manufactures high end textile and paper products from wedding dresses to greeting cards for designers from all over the world. Karen's mission began four years ago when she invited three women into her home to learn life skills, sewing and hear a Gospel message. It is an amazing story of how a project dedicated to seeing God glorified by reaching out to women in need has flourished.

Next steps for Karen and the women of Jacobs Well is to find more designers who have plans and customers for their products. It is exciting to think that God is involved in touching the lives of people working in the clothing and accessories industry in India!
