As many of you know, GHI has partnered with the Cameroon Baptist Theological Seminary (CBTS) since the late 90s. GHI has worked in many ways over the years with leaders of CBTS by sending visiting professors, hosting several faculty at Bethel Seminary, assisting with building projects, and even collaborating on a few books. GHI has been a partner with the leaders at CBTS for over 13 years. One of the faculty members currently connected with GHI is Dieudonne Tamfu. Dieudonne is working on a graduate degree at The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. In a trip sponsored by Bethlehem Baptist of Minneapolis, he hosted and worked with Prof. Brett Toney from The Bethlehem College and Seminary, co-teaching Old Testament and New Testament Exegesis. Moreover, this September we received our first donation toward efforts to strengthen the library at the school.

Authentic Community Transformation (ACT) Worldwide is beginning its focus on French speaking parts of Africa and holds up the prospect of being involved in Haiti. Joe Fry, the Director of ACT Worldwide, speaks of ACT Worldwide this way: "[to] bring glory to God by joining with Him in fostering whole-life transformation among disadvantaged, unreached and under served communities." ACT Worldwide will operate primarily through extended cross-cultural mentoring partnerships with organizations and ministries whose desire is for this vision to become a reality in their own context. The near-term geographic focus will be in Africa and Haiti. ACT Worldwide's primary methodology will involve discipling individuals and groups toward reconciliation of broken relationships that characterize poverty: man with God, man with man, man with himself, and man with the environment.
