The following are impressions of Ron Hart, President of Blessed Hope Ministries Inc., after his visit to CP Sapling: We traveled to several cities in The Zainos' Country of service. Our final destination was with Chris and Siu Yuk.

As a board member for CP Sapling, I was anxious to see their work with families with children with specials needs.

Upon our arrival we were immediately taken to one of two facilities. Both properties are three story buildings, remodeled extensively and equipped for therapeutic and educational ministries to children and family with needs. We were impressed by how clean and functional these buildings were kept. Some children live on the premises while others are brought in for

services. More than eleven staff workers (mostly young adults) are trained or being trained to help with this growing ministry.

The local community in this large and beautiful coastal city has a

growing love and appreciation for the work of CP Sapling. The CP stands for "Children of Promise." Like many modern countries, the once strong family structure in that country has fallen apart. The "one child" law has brought on high adoption and suicide rates. Disabled and female babies are often discarded for the preferred "perfect" male child. CP Sapling works with families showing them that their children are gifts from God and "Children of Promise" regardless of their sex or imperfections. Many families have come to accept and love the Lord through this ministry.

Not only is CP Sapling a ministry to the children (helping them to enjoy life more fully and cope with their limitations). It is a

ministry to the parents and other family members (helping them to see their special needs children as a blessing and not a burden). It is also a ministry to a growing number of staff who work with Chris and Siu Yuk in this ministry. The staff are growing in their walk with the Lord. Parents are discovering God's love and children are finding strength and joy even in their difficult lives. CP Sapling is truly a ministry that is "a family of friends and a friend to the family."

It is estimated that 153 million will never be treated. The staff are doing well, but it has been stressful at times. Siu Yuk also developed a cyst on her vocal cord. It will become sore easily now. Additionally, we developed a lice infestation. We had to make a trip to Hong Kong to get some medicine. In the end, the lice returned. We are clean now. Praise God for that.

After all that, our house was broken into. The thieves fished the house keys from a purse by reaching through a window and opened the front door. They came right into the room where the girls were sleeping. This was scary, but nobody was hurt. The

She is now healed and doing great. The van fund raiser was a great success and we are in the process of ordering the van and making the adaptations. We just started our fourth playgroup location and the playgroup was a great success. Peace's mother is helping out at CP Sapling. We are helping her as she helps us.

Our revised website is up and running and our research department has been very active. We are researching the resources

We are also very excited that we have just recently had two more families come to accept Christ. They both came to Christ through our home visit program. John, with Down Syndrome, is currently attending our care

center five days a week. We have been working with him, but also working with his mother to teach her how to teach him. The other family has a child, Sandy, who is 17 years old with severe disability.
